The college serves a total of 1294 students in the Aided stream and 1197 students in the self-supporting stream. The average pass percentage of the UG programmes in Shift I was 88.73% and 83.73% in Shift II. The pass percentage of Shift I PG programme was 95% and 100% for Shift II PG programmes.

PLACEMENT

I would like to record my appreciation to the placement cell for their outstanding efforts and dedication in helping students secure rewarding opportunities. Their constant support, guidance, and seamless coordination with companies have made a significant difference in students' career paths this year. The tireless efforts they put into organizing interviews, preparing students for the job market, and ensuring they are well-prepared for the challenges ahead are truly commendable. The following is a brief summary of the Placement activities for the Academic Year 2024-2025

As a part of “Barclays Life Skills Training Program” Elios Management Consultancy Pvt. Ltd., conducted a One-day Placement Training on 28/08/24 for final year Commerce and Chemistry students of Shift I and arranged a Campus Drive with TVS Wheels India Ltd, Thiruvallur District on 30/08/24. Total 103 candidates participated and 28 students i.e. 21 from Chemistry and 7 from Commerce received offer letters.

Mega Job Fair was conducted for the academic year 2024-2025 on 03/01/25 in our campus. Dr S Shyamala Devi, Placement coordinator of Shift I and Dr N Ramani, Placement coordinator of Shift II coordinated the event with their Team. More than 17 companies actively participated in the recruitment process. Students shown their interest in multiple companies and attended the interview. Out of 893 final year students from both Shift I & Shift II, 633 students received their offer letters and results awaited from 4 companies.

Key Activity Highlights

- ✓ Final year students of both Shift I & Shift II attended/attending the Certificate Training Program under CSR funding in the various companies with minimum training period of 30 days to maximum of 90 days.

- ✓ Anudip Foundation for Social welfare, Chennai, trained 16 Commerce students with “Advanced program in Accounting with Tally Prime” and received their Convocation certificates. Across Chennai colleges, the Company had totally trained 390 students for this financial year and among many, our student Ms Revathi S received her Achievement Award (1st) for her active performance throughout the course period.
- ✓ Magic Bus India Foundation, Velachery, Chennai, trained 19 students on “Soft skills & Life skills” for 45 days and among many Ms. Swetha K of III BA English Literature, given title as a “Brand Ambassador” and received a certificate of excellence for her outstanding performance. All the students have graduated from the course
- ✓ Titan Leap in association with Naandi Foundation, Guindy has trained nearly 150 students on Employability Skills with a monthly stipend of Rs 1000/ each, by providing mid-day meal during the program. Students attended the course in 2 batches and received the course completion certificates
